Tarlochan Singh Sidhu (Independent)

Sidhu is a businessman who has lived in Ward 10 for over 15 years. He says he wants to “put Ward 10 priorities above political agendas,” with a vision “to create opportunities for everyone and to ensure that no one is left behind.” Sidhu is campaigning on keeping property taxes “fair and manageable,” modernizing infrastructure and clearing snow on all residential streets.

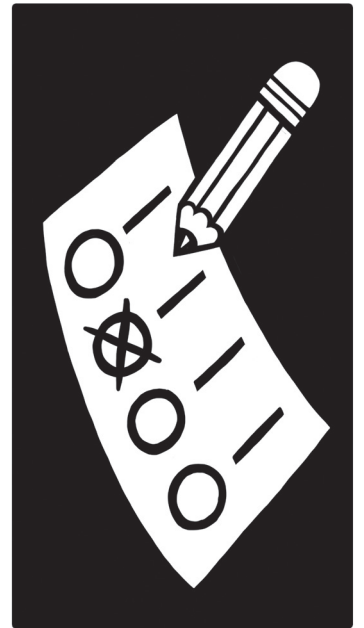

Every four years Calgarians elect a new city council. On October 20, 2025, voters choose a mayor, city councillors and school board trustees.

Calgary's electoral system is divided into 14 regions, or wards, across the city. Each city councillor represents a specific ward.

The duties of city councillors are spelled out in Alberta's Municipal Government Act. Councillors are tasked with “developing and evaluating” policies and programs while also considering “the welfare and interests of the municipality as a whole.”



Nickie Brockhoff (The Calgary Party)

Brockhoff is a longtime community association manager who works with the Crossroads Community Association in Ward 10, among other community groups. She runs her own consulting company, Kalexa Consulting, which specializes in community association management, and wants to bring a “strong, authentic community voice” to city hall.



Andre Chabot (Communities First Party)

Chabot was first elected to Calgary city council in a 2005 by-election. He ran for mayor in 2017 when his ward was changed due to a redrawing of electoral boundaries, placing third. In 2021, Chabot was elected as Ward 10 councillor again. Prior to politics, Chabot worked as a general contractor and volunteered on the board of the Marlborough Park Community Association.



Mahmoud Mourra (Independent)

Mourra is a businessman and parental rights activist. Born in Lebanon, Mourra has lived in Calgary for 25 years. He says “Ward 10 has been left behind” by city hall and deserves equal investment. Mourra is calling for a big public park like Confederation Park in the ward and says he’ll stand for “fairness, family values, and the hardworking spirit of Ward 10.”
