Daniel James (DJ) Kelly (The Calgary Party)

Kelly ran in Ward 4 in the 2021 election, losing to Sean Chu by 100 votes. A former city hall employee, Kelly is director of community partnerships at the U of C and a former president of the Winston Heights/Mountview Community Association. Kelly is campaigning on "bringing people together to solve problems" and "streamlining city operations to reduce inefficiencies."

Jeremy Wong (Communities First party)

Wong has worked as a policy coordinator for the City of Calgary and pastor for Calgary Chinese Alliance Church. He ran as the UCP candidate for Calgary-Mountain View in the 2019 provincial election, placing second. Wong is campaigning to repeal blanket rezoning, invest in Ward 4 recreation facilities and "foster stronger relationships between law enforcement and residents."

Sheldon Yakiwchuk (Independent)

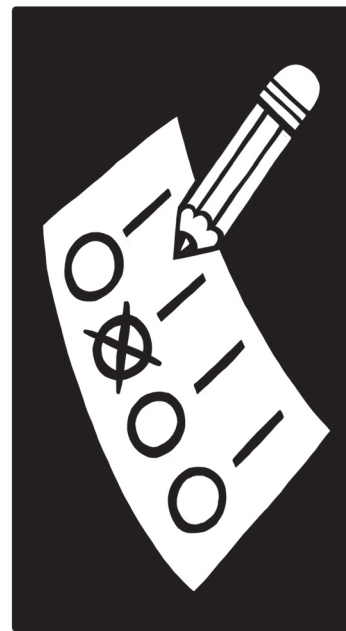

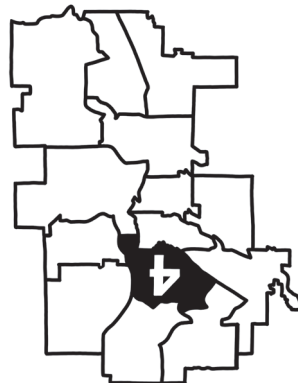

WARD 4

Every four years Calgarians elect a new city council. On October 20, 2025, voters choose a mayor, city councillors and school board trustees.

Calgary's electoral system is divided into 14 regions, or wards, across the city. Each city councillor represents a specific ward.

The duties of city councillors are spelled out in Alberta's Municipal Government Act. Councillors are tasked with "developing and evaluating" policies and programs while also considering "the welfare and interests of the municipality as a whole."
